Biodiesel Industries is proud to announce its teaming with Sodexo, Islands Café, and California State University Channel Islands as part of the California Green Restaurants program. All of the used cooking oil generated by Sodexo at Islands Café is being recycled to make biodiesel fuel locally through a Cooperative Research and Development Agreement with the U.S. Navy at Port Hueneme. Biodiesel is a clean-burning renewable fuel that can be produced from vegetable oils, animal fats, and used cooking oils. It can be run in any diesel engine with minimal or no modifications and easily interchanged or blended with petroleum diesel. In addition it reduces harmful emissions by an average of about 80%. The waste cooking oil generated by Sodexo at Islands Café will be used to mitigate an annual average of:

- 2,500 gallons of imported petroleum
- 8 lbs of carbon dioxide emissions
- 3 lbs of particulate matter emissions
- 3 lbs of volatile organic compounds

By allowing their waste to be recycled into a clean burning local fuel Sodexo, Islands Café, and CSUCI are helping to clean our air, create local jobs, reduce our dependence on foreign oil, and foster sustainability in our community. Thank you on behalf of Biodiesel Industries.
